This worship order is planned by the MTC Sunday School and the participants of VBS 2016. The VBS is always a joint program of the East Parade CSI Church and our Mar Thoma Syrian Church. This year's VBS was held from 20th to 30th of April 2016 and hosted by The Mar Thoma Syrian Church, Primrose Road. 235 children registered, out of which 156 were from Mar Thoma Syrian Church, 61 from East Parade CSI and others from Pentecostal, Orthodox and Catholic Church. There were 28 teachers and 13 Volunteers.

This year's VBS leaders were from the Scripture Union team and led by Mr. Sam Jaisunder who is the Director of VBS 2016 along with his team members Miss Janet from Chennai, Mr. John from Ooty and Miss Shyalima from Bangalore.

The Theme of VBS 2016 was **Sing for Joy** based on Psalm 98:4. Various theme based activities were held on each day like Mask Day to know who we are, Warrior's Day based on faith, Unique Day referring to being a child of God, the Day of Giving, the Love Feast where children bring food and share with others, Scripture Museum Day where children bring the Bible to life in their classroom by making models and paintings; and applying these lessons in their daily life.

Our Sunday School has 313 students and 32 teachers along with 9 volunteers. Our Church follows the Mar Thoma Sunday School Samajam curriculum.
