Meditation

L: "Don't let anyone think less of you because you are young. Be an example to all believers in what you say, in the way you live, in your love, your faith, and your purity." - 1Timothy 4:12, NLT Reality television seems to catch people in the act of everyday life, showing the entire world the truth about those involved in sometimes normal – and not so normal – situations. What if you lived your life similar to a reality show, where the world could look in and see the real you, transparent at all times? Do you ever find yourself pretending to be someone you're not? How many times have you hidden your emotions and told someone you were okay when your feelings were hurt or you were angry? Maybe there were times when you told people what you thought they wanted to hear instead of being truthful with them.

In the book Unchristian by David Kinnaman and Gabe Lyons, a major research project conducted by The Barna Group explains that Christianity has an image problem. The study provides detailed insight into the opinions of sixteen to twenty-nine year olds, demonstrating that Christians have almost completely failed in one of their most important assignments representing Christ to the world. Today Christians are perceived as being no different than those outside the Church. Christians deal with the same problems as unbelievers. The divorce rate; debt and mental emotional; and physical-appearance issues are no different. Looking from the outside in, it doesn't appear that Christians have anything to give the world.

People are looking for answers. They are disappointed to find that even those who believe in a loving God are indifferent towards pointing others to Him with the same mission and vision that Jesus demonstrated. Jesus was unconventional. He opposed the religious, man-made interpretations of the law and looked to the heart of those who were outcasts, sick and hurting. He cared about the ones society ignored.

God wants us to set ourselves apart for His service. We are called to be examples to those who do not know him. We have to get outside the four walls of the church and live in a way that demonstrates

to others what God is like. Like Jesus we must say and do only what the Father tells us to say and do. We must be real – true to the word of God, following Jesus and modelling His example. He demonstrated love for the lost, that society had thrown away. He came to testify to the truth that God loves each one of us.

As we grow up and move on with our lives, ask God to show you the power of living a transparent life. Let Him help you shake off the façade of what you believe others would want you to be and step into the light of God's truth.
