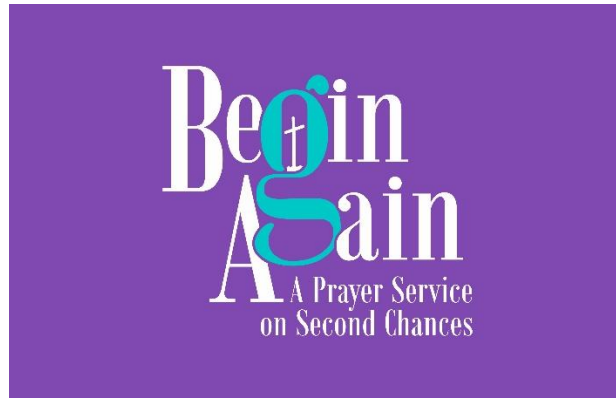




Begin Again
